

Instructions for Second Life tour.

Download and install Second Life Client.

You can download SL client from
<http://secondlife.com/community/downloads.php>

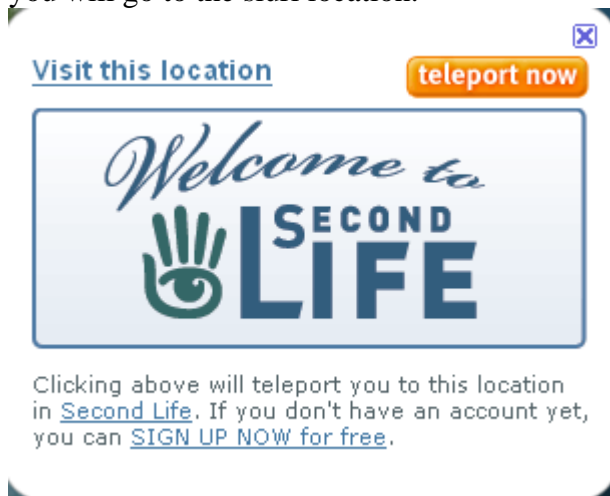
Open New Account It is free to join. Choose Basic Membership. (if you do not have one already). <https://secure-web2.secondlife.com/join/>

You will be asked to pick a Second Life Name and choose a basic avator. You can change the way your avatar looks later. You will be asked to upgrade to a premium account but DO NOT at this time. There is no need. Choose “Skip this step.”

You will be sent a confirmation email at the address you provided. It may take a while to get your email. You need to follow the instructions in the email to activate that account. If you have already downloaded the software you will just have to respond to the email by clicking the link.

The first time you log in you will be asked to agree to with the SL Standards.

Log into SL using your new account and walk through Orientation Island. OR Use this url to go directly to New Media Consortia Orientation (most feel it is easier, less complex and you do not get stuck) <http://slurl.com/secondlife/NMC%20Orientation/69/107/32/> Whenever you use the slurl, you will get a graphic like below. Hit “Teleport now” and you will go to the slurl location.



After orientation you may visit NMC, Education Island, Information Island, etc. or just explore.

The meeting place for the workshop will be at the café in Virtual Starry Night

There are two ways to get to Virtual Starry Night. Easiest: You can use direct link from this text: <http://slurl.com/secondlife/Luctesa/111/128/25> (it should open your SL client, ask you to log in and teleport you directly to this location),

If it doesn't work, use the traditional way.

- * Log into your Second Life account

- * Click on the "Search" button on the bottom of the screen. Choose the Places tab and enter Virtual Starry Night in the input field. Then press Search.

Highlight "Virtual Starry Night" line in search results, and click "Teleport" button on the bottom of the screen.
